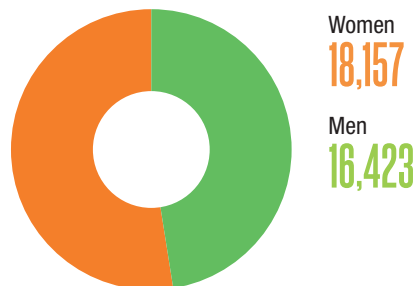

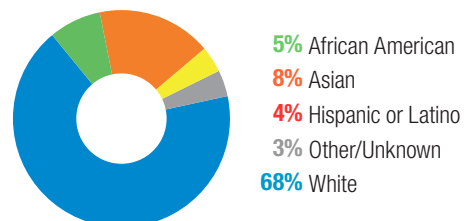

## REPUTATION

Pitt is the world's **TOP UNIVERSITY FOR PHILOSOPHY**, according to the 2018 QS World University Rankings by Subject. Pitt also was highly rated for nursing (16th) and medicine (36th).

In its *Guide to 375 Green Colleges*, the Princeton Review has ranked Pitt among the **MOST ENVIRONMENTALLY RESPONSIBLE COLLEGES** in the United States and Canada. Also *SIERRA Magazine* named Pitt **ONE OF AMERICA'S "COOL SCHOOLS"** for its commitment to environmentalism.

Thomson Reuters ranked Pitt 30th on its list of the **WORLD'S 100 MOST INNOVATIVE UNIVERSITIES** based on such criteria as research output and patent filings. In fact, Pitt innovators launched 29 start-ups in fiscal year 2017, acquired 102 patents, and filed 329 invention disclosures. In total, Pitt innovators received more than **\$4.2 MILLION IN PRECOMMERCIALIZATION FUNDING**.

Pitt received INSIGHT Into Diversity's **2017 HIGHER EDUCATION EXCELLENCE IN DIVERSITY AWARD** for its outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion.

Pitt's Cathedral of Learning and Allegheny Observatory are designated as landmarks in the **NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES**. Four Pitt buildings have earned Pennsylvania state historical designations, and 17 buildings are Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation Historic Landmarks.
